Why is the network important?

Equipment reuse impacts the future by:

Increasing the independence of consumers: Being able to access equipment (not covered by insurance, ineligible for funding, or no available funding) makes it possible for Nebraskans to be independent at home, school, and work.

Protects our environment: Every year over 2 million tons of medical waste is produced in the United States. This waste fills up our landfills and pollutes our ground water and air.
